Land mines are a pervasive issue worldwide and have an impact on many aspects of a community. Not only are human lives, their safety and security directly threatened, but an economic impact is felt as agriculture and local businesses are stifled. Education suffers as children and teachers are limited in their mobility. The threat of landmines can hold a community hostage for decades.

For 20 years, ITF has been working diligently to combat this insidious threat to human security. Owing to their determined work in mine action, ITF recognized and gradually began addressing other significant threats to human security ranging from the prevention of conflicts to addressing other development and reconstruction issues of post-conflict societies. The scope of their mission has helped to rehabilitate victims, clear landmines, educate at-risk communities, and build national capacities. The organization has had remarkable achievements in every aspect of this mission over the past two decades. ITF has implemented projects in 31 countries and regions, provided psycho-social care to more than 17,500 mine survivors, and over 54,000 people in mine affected countries received mine disability awareness messages. To accomplish all of these programs, ITF has raised more than 430 million USD through donations from over 400 private and public donors.

One of ITF's greatest achievements is their ability to emphasize the "human" aspect in Enhancing Human Security. Their personal and respectful approach to humanitarian aid stresses collaboration and coordination which always puts those affected at the forefront. Since 1998, ITF has assisted 1,303 individuals who have been disabled for life due to the blast of a landmine or other explosive ordnance. All of those 1,303 individuals were physically rehabilitated and given the opportunity to live productive, fulfilling lives just like any other member of their community. All of them could serve as an inspiration to all of us, who are fortunate enough to live in a landmine-free environment.

It is thanks to their donor and public support that ITF has been able to become a leader in human security, and that has allowed ITF to reach an impressive milestone of helping people and communities around the world for two decades. ITF should therefore serve as an inspiration for recognizing their great needs.


BORIS FRLEC



Dr. Boris Frlec was the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic Slovenia during the establishment of ITF. Together with Dr. Madeleine Albright, U.S. State Secretary, he signed the Letter of Intent on 4 November 1998, which enabled ITF's future development. As a permanent representative of the Slovenian government in the ITF Board of Advisors, and with his vast diplomatic experience he established a long-lasting relationship with the ever-growing donor community. Due to his efforts and contributions, ITF remains one of the most successful Slovenian international projects.

Harry Murphey McCloy is an expert in mine action and considered as the initiator of the first mine action office at the U.S. Department of State. Working closely with ITF since its very beginnings, he helped facilitate the continuous support of the organization's biggest donor, the United States of America. DIJANA PLEŠTINA



Dr. Dijana Pleština has been actively involved in the mine action community since 2000, first as Advisor in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and from 2012 as Director of the Government Office for Mine Action as well as President of the Governing Board of CROMAC. For 15 years, she worked closely with ITF as a member of its Managing Board making a positive impact on its development as an institution. As an ardent advocate for rights of mine victims, she focused her work through the Convention to Ban Anti-Personnel Landmines as well as the Cluster Munitions Convention. The legacy of her work can be observed through the improved and strengthened mine action community in South East Europe and beyond.


KEN RUTHERFORD



Dr. Ken Rutherford is a professor of political science at James Madison University and the Director of the Center for International Stabilization and Recovery (CISR), a public policy, overseas programming and research center focusing on humanitarian mine action. Acting as an expert in the field of mine action, publishing five books and numerous articles, a landmine survivor, and an outspoken advocate for victim and survivor assistance, Ken has aided ITF with their work in the mine action community and facilitated progress towards increased safety for mine-affected communities, particularly in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

numerous partners.


ALASTAIR McASLAN



Alastair McAslan began his involvement in mine action in 1997 as the UK Government Advisor to UNMAS. From 2002, he was Director of Humanitarian Resilience at Cranfield University, UK which worked closely with ITF for five years to develop and deliver management training courses. Alastair worked alongside ITF again in 2008 to develop their new vision and helped ITF apply its unique set of knowledge, experience and values to the broader challenge of human security.

From International Trust Fund for Demining and Mine Victims Assistance, working in 1 country exclusively in the field of mine action, it has grown into **ITF Enhancing Human Security** we know today, present in **31 countries and regions** around the world in the field of human security.

ZILHA & ZAHID ČIKMIŠ



Zilha and Zahid Čikmiš fled their home in Ravne as armed conflict intensified in Bosnia and Herzegovina between 1992 and 1995. Eleven years later, Zahid and Zilha, both in their mid-70s, returned to the village of Ravne. They found their house in ruins and their property and surrounding community littered with landmines. Thanks to humanitarian mine action, both can now move around their property freely without fearing for their lives or the lives of their relatives.

Over 148 million square meters
of mine and UXO contaminated land has been cleared in South East
Europe, Lebanon and Azerbaijan.


HASAN HAMZEH



Hasan Hamzeh is a farmer in Lebanon, whose citrus fruit farm was once contaminated with landmines. Thanks to mine clearance projects facilitated through ITF and implemented by NGO Norwegian People's Aid, the area was cleared and Hasan was able to continue farming his citrus fruits safely. Landmines can endanger the lives of farmers and their agricultural businesses, which in turn creates an economic impact on post-conflict communities. Hasan represents one of the countless farmers and societies around the world, who have benefited from international humanitarian mine action.

Around 80 % of the funds
raised by ITF were contributed to various clearance activities.

SCOTTY LEE



Scotty Lee is the CEO and Founder of Spirit of Soccer, a non-profit organization established in May 1996. The international children's charity specializes in providing mine risk education on explosive remnants of war in highly contaminated areas of the world, using soccer games and drills.

**Almost 500,000
schoolchildren and adults**

in mine-contaminated areas received mine risk education directly.

NATALIJA LAFAZAN



Nataliia Lafazan from Ukraine lost her leg at the age of 10 during the recent conflict in Ukraine. Since 2015, ITF has been working closely with her father and the University Rehabilitation Institute of the Republic of Slovenia (URI – Soča) to provide Nataliia with continuous rehabilitation treatment. Nataliia has so far successfully completed three phases of rehabilitation, each of which helped her become an active and fulfilled 13-year-old that she is today.

More than 1,300 mine survivors
from various countries and regions received rehabilitation treatment in Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Lebanon.


FATIMA AL-A'ASSI



Fatima Al-A'assi is the principal of Al-Nahda School in the Gaza Strip. In her capacity as the principal, she enables a programme of psychosocial support at her school. It is vital to support organizations and the people who provide psychosocial rehabilitation for traumatized children. Fatima is fulfilling ITF's mission by helping affected communities and individuals minimize the psychological consequences of conflict.

From Gaza Strip and the West Bank,
109 mine/ERW survivors were rehabilitated, and
26 Prosthetics and Orthotics specialists trained.

MIRSAD MIROJEVIĆ



Mirsad Mirojević is the Director of the sitting volleyball club OKI Fantomi from Sarajevo and a mine survivor himself. OKI Fantomi encompass the values of ITF as they enable individuals to transcend the consequences of conflicts. With the ultimate goal of helping affected communities and individuals develop to their full potential, OKI Fantomi and Mirsad continue to be an inspiration to ITF's work and mission.

Over 17,500 mine survivors
and other disabled persons received psychosocial assistance
through sport, peer support or other activities.

TAMILA JOLBORDI



Tamila Jolbordi from Georgia was able to receive micro-grants and vocational training, supported by ITF, which enabled her to establish her own company. Her company, which produces vegetables, is able to support her entire family and demonstrates how economic support is a key element of post-conflict rehabilitation and sustainability.

Over 910 mine survivors

that were engaged in socio-economic programs received either economic assets, loans or scholarships.

ANICA MIKUŠ KOS




Dr. Anica Mikuš Kos is a renowned expert in the field of child psychiatry from war-zones and a longstanding supporter of humanitarian action through psychosocial aid. She has devoted her life to the issue of child psychiatry by working as the head of the child psychiatry department at the Clinic of Pediatrics – University Children's Hospital and at Counselling Centre for Children, Adolescents and Parents in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Anica currently serves as president of the Slovene Philanthropy, and has been working with ITF in Kosovo* and primarily in Gaza Strip, since 2007.

Nearly 1,450 children
from Gaza Strip and Ukraine, affected by instability and armed conflict, received psychosocial rehabilitation and treatment.

*This designation is without prejudice to positions on status, and is in line with UNSCR 1244 and the ICJ opinion on the Kosovo declaration of independence.

IGOR ŠUMAR & YSER



Igor Šumar is a professional trainer and handler of mine detection dogs (MDD). Yser, a Belgian Shepherd, and Igor joined forces in December 2013, after completing the training conducted by Mine Detection Dog Center in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Together, as employees of the Civil Protection Administration of Republika Srpska, the dynamic duo travels to different parts of BIH detecting landmines. Each square meter searched and each day spent in the field together deepens the bond between Yser and Igor.

ITF, in cooperation with Mine Detection Dog Center BIH and Marshall Legacy Institute U.S., trained and provided more than **160 mine detection dogs** to various mine action programmes around the world.

VIOLETA DUKAJ




Violeta Dukaj is a former deminer at NGO Danish Church Aid. While studying mathematics, Violeta changed her profession and became a deminer in Albania. She successfully led a group of deminers for a year and a half, yet tragically lost her leg during a mine accident. She was unable to continue her demining career with the prosthetic leg, but instead joined the survey team and remained involved with mine action for the next few years.

Over 1,200 experts

received training in the field of humanitarian demining, victim assistance, stockpile destruction, physical security and stockpile management, and/or mine action management.

MEDETBEK SULTANBEKOV



Colonel Medetbek Sultanbekov assisted ITF as the Head of Missile and Artillery Department of the State Committee for the Defense of Kyrgyz Republic. He works with ITF with the goal of disposing ammunition with expired shell life, which poses a serious threat to human security. Medetbek has also worked as an advocate for trainings that raise the professional standard of stockpiling weapons safely and securely.

Over 1,300,000 items
of excess and obsolete ammunition were destroyed.

KHATERA AZIMI



Khatera Azimi has since 2007 worked as a physiotherapist in the Mine Detection Center (MDC) Polyclinic in Kabul, supported also by ITF. The MDC Polyclinic in Kabul is one of the physiotherapy centers that also employs female doctors. It is financially supported by donors, who recognized the importance of MDC doctors, such as Khatera, who treated and rehabilitated over 40,000 patients during 2016 and 2017.

Through capacity building of medical services, ITF trained and supported
the work of **nearly 120 doctors**
and other medical personnel in Afghanistan and Cabo Verde.

ABDOU LAT GUEYE



Dr. Gueye Abdou Lat is the Director of the Economic Community of West African States' Early Warning Directorate. As an expert in Geographic Information Systems he has held this position since 2014. Abdou Lat has been working closely with ITF since 2015, when ITF launched the project aiming to enhance West Africa's regional and national capacities to identify, respond to, and stem developing crises more effectively.

5 national early warning and response centers have been established in 5 ECOWAS member states. The remaining 10 states are in the process of establishing their national centers as well.

ARNE HODALIČ



Arne Hodalič is a long-time associate and advocate of ITF. As one of the most renowned Slovenian photographers, Arne has been working with various magazines such as National Geographic Magazine, Time Magazine, Life and many others. With his generous help and professional relationship, he and his photos vastly contributed to the visibility of challenges at the core of ITF's work.

ITF Doll is a symbol of ITF and its work. The doll is a girl, who loved playing in the fields with other children. Then one day, she ran too far – into a minefield. She lost her leg in an explosion, which changed her life forever. However, with receiving holistic support and long-term rehabilitation, she has grown into an active member of the society.

ITF has grown into a big community. It brings together its staff and leadership; the donors, who continuously invest trust and provide funds; and partners, who ensure smooth operation in often austere environments. Making the mission of ITF particularly fulfilling are the countless accounts of those ITF has been able to assist over the years, and many of whom have become ITF's life-long friends.



As ITF marks 2018 as the year of our 20th anniversary, we are more focused on the future than ever before. In taking stock of the past two decades, we have witnessed and adapted to the developing challenges facing the world, humanity and human security in particular.

We have experienced how a growing number of societies are becoming vulnerable and at risk, and how they are affected by alternative types of weapons and other explosive ordnance, modern kinds of warfare, contemporary types of conflicts, new migration flows, and emerging environmental challenges among others. Twenty years ago, ITF was an organization addressing landmine contamination in one country alone. Two decades' worth of experience has taught us that strong and genuine partnerships allow us to avoid overlap or duplication of our efforts and prevent unproductive rivalry. Strong and genuine partnerships allow us to incorporate local expertise and observe cultural differences. They further allow us to maximize the effects of synergies between diverse actors and look for complementarity, particularly as we aim to take part in transforming the world and addressing the internationally set goals. Finally, strong and genuine partnerships allow us to work hand-in-hand with at-risk societies in empowering individuals, giving the voices to the local communities and building their own national institutional capacities to address their own needs sustainably and in the long-term.

Strong and genuine partnerships are set to remain at the heart of what we do at ITF. ITF's future will involve our donors who have so far been an integral part of our work through their contributions and individual visions. We will remain dedicated to maintaining our reputation of a respectful and transparent partner within our existing community. Finally, we will continue to make our expertise, knowledge, experience and drive available to those who might gain from our assistance.
